Second Lesson: Philippians 2:1-13 **Gospel**: Matthew 21:23-32



The Feast of Saint Michael and All Angels (Michaelmas) is observed on September 29.

The name Michaelmas comes from a shortening of "Michael's Mass," in the same style as Christmas (Christ's Mass). The Archangel Michael is seen as one of the principal angelic warriors, a protector against the dark of night, and administrator of cosmic intelligence. Michael is generally referred to as Saint Michael, as in the Litany of the Saints. In Episcopal tradition, three or four archangels are celebrated on the Feast of Saint Michael and All Angels: Michael, Gabriel and Raphael, and often, Uriel.

The Book of Revelation describes a war in heaven in which Michael defeats Satan. After the conflict, Satan is thrown to earth, where he tries to "lead the whole world astray." According to Hebrew scholars, Michael prevented Isaac from being sacrificed by his father by substituting a ram in his place, and saved Jacob, while yet in his mother's womb, from being killed by Samael. Later, Mi-

chael prevented Laban from harming Jacob. It was Michael who wrestled with Jacob and who afterward blessed him.

Early Christians regarded Michael as a healer. A painting of Michael slaying a serpent at eventually led to the standard iconography of Archangel Michael as a warrior saint slaying a dragon, a serpent or the defeated figure of Satan. In other depictions, Michael may be holding a pair of scales in which he weighs the souls of the departed and may hold the book of life (as in the Book of Revelation), to show that he takes part in the judgment. According to medieval Christian theologians, angels are organized into several

orders, or "Angelic Choirs" and are assigned specific missions and activities. In the 13th century, Michael was identified as the prince of the Seraphim, the first of the nine angelic orders. According to Saint Thomas Aquinas, Michael is the Prince of the last and lowest choir.


